CAREER PLACEMENT

The Yale French Department supports its students entering the job market with a complete and energetic program of training and advising. An organizational meeting is held at the end of the spring semester to prepare candidates for the process that begins in the fall.

The Director of Graduate Studies is the Departmental Placement Officer. Working with a faculty committee and with each student's dissertation director, the DGS oversees all aspects of placement and advises students at each stage. This includes the preparation of all documents (letter, CV, dissertation abstract, syllabi, statement of teaching philosophy, etc.). The DGS is also able to review dossiers of recommendations before they are sent out. Once application materials are finished, the focus of the program shifts to performative skills, including job talks and rehearsals for interviews.

In the fall of each year, the Director of Graduate Studies offers an intensive preparation workshop for candidates, "Seminar on the Profession," available only to French department students who are on the job market.

The Yale Graduate School also provides a generous program of support and advising for job candidates. Students should avail themselves of those resources in order to gain a broader perspective, but the departmental support system is finely tailored to the specifics of the academic job market in French and Francophone Studies and connected fields.
